


Recent Studies

- Housing needs and affordability assessments throughout the Commonwealth
- Short-term rentals on the Cape
- Homebuilding policy and financing plans for the state
- Impediments to fair housing

Common Threads

- Economic growth is concentrated in Boston metro, but affordability is a problem statewide
- Affordability is most problematic for renters
 - And thus, for groups overrepresented among renters, namely Black and Hispanic households
- Lack of supply, driven by underbuilding, is a critical factor driving up costs
 - Second homes a factor in seasonal markets (Cape Cod, Berkshires)
- Building housing that is affordable is not currently possible at prevailing prices for land, labor, and materials
 - Approx. \$450,000/unit, incl. land


Percent of Households that are Housing Cost Burdened (Renter-Occupied and Owner-Occupied Units) by


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Cumulative Housing Units Permitted in Massachusetts from 2018-2025
